- Freedom of voters and candidates to have equal access to polling stations

• Freedom of candidates to have equal access to and obtain feedback (vote outcome) from an impartial board or committee of elections

At a time when we have a muzzled parliament and an appallingly weak judiciary in Ethiopia, the EPRDF government is trying to deflect the pro-democracy sentiment in Ethiopia through its end-justify-means ideology.
